

## Working With Groups of Pictures and More Online Editors

1. Sometimes you might want to take a number of pictures and put them together into a single picture.
2. Go to [www.photovisi.com](http://www.photovisi.com)
3. photovisi provides a number of templates that can be used to create computer wallpaper sized collages of photos. Click on *Click here to start!*
4. Then look at the templates given and click on the one you'd like to use.
5. Next, click on *Click here to upload photos!* Notice the note about holding down control (Ctrl) to select multiple photos at once. Choose up to the maximum number of photos listed under the template.
6. It will take some time to upload and arrange the files. Once it's completed you'll see a preview of your collage. If you'd like to replace any pictures, you can do so.
7. When you're satisfied with the layout and pictures, click *Preview OK? Click here to continue!*
8. Finally, you can click on one of the given links to download the image. I recommend choosing the largest one available, 1280x800.
9. Save your finished product and show me what you've created through all the tutorials.
